

Training Toolkit for boosting humanitarian migrants, migrants and refugees' inclusion through Peer Mentoring

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NEWSLETTER 1 - PRESENTATION OF THE PROJECT - FALL 2022

The project team lead by Moviéndote from Spain and including Stiftelsen Kursverksamheten Vid Uauniversitet from Sweden and Istanbul Valiligi from Turkey are working to launch a new Erasmus + project called Peer4Inclusion. This project aims to promote the inclusion of migrants, humanitarian migrants and refugees through the development of a methodological framework and innovative training material that will allow organizations and training centers that work on the processes of initial insertion of newlyarrived migrants to have innovative learning resources to be used.

In a context where migrant integration has gained prominence on the global agenda with the advent of the 2030 Sustainable Development, and due to the fact that migrants and refugees face worse conditions than EU citizens, the successful integration of these migrant communities into civic and political life is essential if a cohesive and inclusive society in Europe is to be achieved. However, the Ukrainian war revealed the vulnerability of our integration mechanisms for migrants and refugees around the world so that there is more than ever needed to reshape current structures by promoting a more inclusive and sustainable model. The rising rate of unemployment, coupled with the increasing rate of migration within and into Europe, makes migrants' integration into the labor market and/or education systems a genuinely difficult task; one that is harder than for the nationals of the country.

The team will create, on the one hand, the Peer4Inclusion Handbook, which presents the methodological framework for the application of Peer Mentoring Models in adult training and in sociolabour programs for migrants and refugees, and on the other hand, the Peer4Inclusion Training Course, including practical resources such as sucess stories from inspiring migrants.







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
